GHS Graduation Requirements

How to earn 240 credits:

5 credits are earned for each course passed

60% or a D- is required to pass the class

70% or a C- is required to meet college entrance requirements and to meet pre-requisites for higher level classes

A Full-time student takes 4 classes per trimester:

12 courses per year (4 per trimester) will keep a student on track for graduation:

- 60 credits x 4 years = 12 courses/years = 240 credits
- Use the GHS 4 year plan to track completion of required courses and electives



Students must pass the State PE fitness exam. If not, they will continue taking two-trimesters of PE each year until the exam is passed

Students participating in **CIF Interscholastic Sports** may be exempt from 1 trimester of sophomore PE per sport if they meet exemption requirements.

Those requirements include <u>all</u> of the following:

- 1. Have satisfactorily passed the PE fitness exam
- 2. Completed PE 1 A/B with a grade of "B" or better
- 3. Have an overall GPA 2.0 or higher in the previous 3 trimesters
- 4. Enrolled as a full-time student
- 5. Must submit a completed contract within 2 weeks of the start of the sport
