- Connectedness to our school is high based on the California Healthy Kids Survey (CHKS) and internal survey data
- Decrease in school attendance by 10%

2018-2019 Data Analysis and Conclusions

- Continue to prepare students for College and Career readiness
- Attendance has declined
- Continue to improve graduation rates
- Suspension increased

2019-2020 Key Strategies to Meet Goals

- Utilize programs such as First Generation Counselor to help students prepare for life after Del Valle and grow partnerships with La Familia to help students successfully transition to college or career.
- Work with District and State to identify how attendance is calculated at continuation schools and implement appropriate systems to record attendance accurately so parents/guardians can be notified.
- Review student progress during weekly staff meetings and add time to discuss and communicate students progress with families through email and phone calls.
- Begin exploring Positive Behavior Intervention Systems and develop school-wide expectations.
