# **Reports**

Principal's Report – Shari Johnston

- Thanks for support on arena day and picture day, ice cream social was fabulous great turn out
- Sharing expectations for the new school year what it's like to be a stingray star
- Play first, then eat program, improved 3-5th, K-2 needs support, referrals for behavior are down! (15 from last year compared to 4 this year in the first week)
- Wed morning meetings all are welcome! great time to review and share information about Choose Love
- School site council needs volunteers (beginning, middle and end of year planning at least 4 meetings)
- October: Oct 1 Kaiser Assembly; "The Best Me" nutrition and being active, Oct 2nd Walk and Roll to School

Teacher's Report – Holly Hamilton (3<sup>rd</sup> -5<sup>th</sup> grade)

- Introduced new 4th grade teacher, Samantha, lots of new teachers!
- Everyone loved the ice cream social, surprised about turn out and hopeful it will continue in the year, grateful for all of the work!
- Request: Katie O'Toole (K teacher) funding for "Happy Numbers" online math program (k-2); supplements in-class instruction, Holly used it last year and shared that her students liked/chose it, was previously funded through LCFF (not available this year); Katie got a discount, the cost is \$2400, including two second grade classrooms opting in; Can PTO fund part or all? students can access at home and in-class; tabled to be reviewed during budget

## Treasurer's Report – Allison Rodacker

- · amended Multi-cultural night
- explained special projects line items, including AR, coding, makers space, etc.
- Great job fund raising last year!
- Asked to elaborate about PE Tech: it will help teachers planning curriculum roll outs and fulfills desire to supplement instructor time, district hired one person to do PE curriculum for elementary level (working with grade level teams, teachers are required to develop lessons, job of the tech is to implement lessons); PE shows benefits to students in and out of the classroom and at home, supports the Choose Love Program, etc. (One example of benefits of PE Tech, Sunset has higher scores on 5th grade fitness assessment, Jackson has lower scores in the district)
- Katy McGuire moved to approve the funding for the PE Tech. Emily Duenas seconded. All PTO members approved

# PCIC report: met today (9/10)

- - rolling out math curriculum no info published yet, but matches the CA Standard of Math, math plan and how we can boost math scores and create supplemental supports; encourages "number sense", growth mindset in math
- Leah finding out information on Friday at the bingo night informational at Granada High
  - use as fundraising for Science Camp?

## Old Business

#### I. Back to School Arena

- Title 1 funding: Fed funding (Whole School = 40% of Ss qualifying in lower socio-economic range) used for reading academy programs; last year at 36%, so funding was cut "Targeted Title 1 Funding" funds need to go directly to students who need support; limits how the funds can be spent
  - support was at back to school arena to help folks sign up; trying to educate but efforts are limited legally, considering calling community members; has impacted school money
  - How can we disseminate information legally? Designated Spanish speaker on PTO? What did Joe Michell do?
  - LCFF funding (foster care, ELLs)
- Teacher accounts district funded \$18/student, but this year it's \$27/student; efforts are being made to figure out how much funding is needed, unsure if funding will cover needs; teachers may need to make requests later in the school year since they ordered supplies at the end of last academic year
- It was noted that Jackson already earns a lot through donors choose, making dollars stretch at Jackson

### II. Ice Cream Social

• Thank to all of the volunteers and teachers! Leah had to go get more supplies, great turn out, needed extra bowls! "really nice to see all the families there"

## III. AR Program

- Title I Whole School funding was used to fund AR program in the past; PTO would like to help fund
- Allison Rodacker moved to approve, seconded by Katy McGuire, all approved.

#### New Business.

#### I. Laminator

- old laminator on its way out! PTO wants to buy a new one using some of the \$5000 funds in special projects); cost with tax by 9/27 \$1951.69
- Shawna Bouligny moved to approve, second by Allison Rodacker, all approved.
