Reports

Principal's Report – Tom Jones (presented by Mark Whatley)

- We are applying for Gold Recognition status following our Silver Recognition status in 2021 and 2022 for PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports). The application is a process that involves looking at our practices overall and how we are doing with fully implementing the components. Some of the key elements we are evaluating and providing evidence of for the application are:
 - Develop a continuum of scientifically based behavior, social emotional and academic interventions and supports.
 - Use data to make decisions and solve problems.
 - Arrange the environment to prevent with the development and occurrence of problem behavior.
 - o Teach and encourage pro-social skills and behaviors.
 - Implement evidence-based behavioral practices with fidelity and accountability.
 - Screen universally and monitor student performances and progress continuously.
- The goal of receiving Gold Recognition is important because it serves more of an accountability and
 evaluation component to see where we are with PBIS implementation and identifies our next areas of
 growth. We are really proud of all we have in place to support students and are excited to demonstrate
 that through the application process.

Teacher's Report - Shannon Smith

- Grateful to the PTO for all the events and support we provide to students and staff
- Star reading test with AR previous discussion if the star reading test was necessary to keep with AR. 2nd and 3rd grade teachers find the star reading test to be a critical component in AR and provide a lot of data so that they are able to best guide and support their students. - Stingray Fund Additional \$3,439.99. YTD \$8,157.48
- Researching Book Vending Machine
 - Cost: \$4,795-\$6,000 depending on customizations/upgrade. Cost is for machine only and does not include books needed for machine.
 - o Machine uses any books which fit in the trays purchased. Tray sizes can be customized.
 - Training is provided through the company and includes remote support with training videos, manuals and phone support.
 - o In person servicing by a certified technician is included at an additional cost.
 - Standard and extended warranties are available.
 - o PTO sourced volunteer would be needed to:
 - Refill machine
 - Recirculate tokens
 - Service machine
 - Order books
 - Teachers needed to plan the implementation:
 - Create the PBIS incentive plan (who gets a token, how often are tokens given, when can tokens be redeemed)
 - Recommend books that should be stocked (reading levels considered?)
 - Does purchase need to go through district?

Growth Mindset Assembly
