## Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District's Measure J Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee

## **Annual Report, Fiscal Year 2017-2018**

On June 7, 2016, two-thirds of Livermore voters passed the \$245 million Measure J Bond, to renovate aging Livermore class-rooms and school facilities. From addressing aging infrastructure, to modernizing outdated facilities and providing 21st century instructional technology, Measure J is meant to support the Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District (LVJUSD) in its mission that "Each student will graduate with the skills needed to contribute and thrive in a changing world."

Under Proposition 39, a school district's Board of Trustees is required to establish and appoint members to an independent citizens' oversight committee. The purpose of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) is to inform and alert the public regarding the expenditures and uses of Measure J Bond money.

## Measure J Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee 2018-2019

Based on our review and observations, the Measure J CBOC finds that the LVJUSD is in compliance with the requirements of Article XIII A, Section 1(b) (3) of the California Constitution, and that funds are being used for the purposes specified by Measure J Bond language, as audited by Nigro & Nigro, PC, a professional accountancy corporation, which disclosed no instances of non-compliance with the terms of Proposition 39 or Measure J.
