

Leo R. Croce School Scholarship

Rewarding Educational Excellence

High school seniors from the Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District who have attended Leo R. Croce Elementary for at least 2 years have the opportunity to win a \$5,000 scholarship by applying for the Leo R. Croce School Scholarship.

Finalists will be selected based on written applications and will be invited to a personal interview with the scholarship committee.

Leo R. Croce was the LVJUSD Superintendent from July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1989. Leo R. Croce Elementary School was named in his honor for meritorious service to Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District. This scholarship was established by Mr. Croce and is given out in his name annually.

Leo R. (Rudolph) Croce was born in Oakland, California on May 14, 1923. He was the fourth child of Italian immigrant parents. Mr. Croce participated in many youth and community activities and he was an Eagle Scout.

During World War II, he served as a combat bomber pilot in the European theater of the war. Upon completion of his combat missions he was assigned as a flight instructor for Air Force cadets.

Mr. Croce graduated from the University of California at Berkley in 1947. He also received his teaching and administrative credentials and his master's degree from U.C.B.

Mr. Croce began his teaching career in the Oakland (California) Unified School district in July, 1948. During his 24 years in that district he served as teacher, counselor, coach, vice-principal, principal and as an Area Superintendent.

On July 1, 1973, Mr. Croce was appointed as superintendent of the Livermore Valley Joint Unified School district. He served as superintendent of the Livermore school district for 16 years. This was the longest tenure of any superintendent in the history of the school district. Mr. Croce retired on June 30, 1989 marking 40 years in public education.

In October of 1991, Mr. Croce was honored. He has been immortalized by the naming of the Leo R. Croce Elementary school.

During his career as an educator, Mr. Croce also taught at the University of California, Berkeley and California State University at Hayward. He also served as an educational consultant to many California school districts.

Mr. Croce was active in local, state, national and international educational organizations. He served in leadership positions in professional groups, including President of Region VII of the Association of California School Administrators.

Mr. Croce had always been very involved in community affairs and community service, with active participation in the Livermore Rotary Club, the Las Positas Seniors Curriculum Committee, the Boy Scouts of America, and the Cerebral Palsy Association for the Bay Area.

On September 28, 1947 Mr. Croce married Pina Ciarlo. They have one daughter, Pamela Croce-Goode, who is also an educator.

In appreciation of the honor of dedicating this school in his name, Mr. Croce and his family established a perpetual scholarship fund. This fund has awarded a college scholarship yearly since 2004, to an outstanding student who attended Leo R. Croce Elementary School and graduated from a LVJUSD high school.

One of the highlights of Mr. Croce's retirement was to visit Croce School and to meet the students, parents and staff at the school activities in which he participated.

On January 27, 2020, Mr. Croce passed away. He will be missed by the community and friends who loved him and the Leo R. Croce Scholarship will continue to honor his legacy.

Application Rules

Qualified college bound students are welcome to apply. Students submitting applications must meet the following rules in order to be considered:

- 1. Applicant must have attended Leo Croce Elementary School for at least two years from TK to 5.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating senior from a high school in the Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District.
- 3. Applicant must plan to attend and have acceptance as a full time student at a four-year college or university.
- 4. While not required, consideration will be given to students who plan a career in education or a related field.
 - * Finalists must take part in an interview with the scholarship committee.
 - * Please type or print legibly all sections of the application. Illegible and incomplete applications will be disqualified.
 - * Applications must be completed and received by March 23, 2023 by 3:45pm.
 - * On a separate paper, 8 1/2 x 11 inches, answer the essay question. Please limit your essay to no more than 750 words, 3 to 5 paragraphs.
 - * Letter of recommendation from an educator (classroom teacher, counselor, administrator)
 - * Letter of recommendation from a community member.
 - * Sign and date the application, confirming that the provided information is correct and the essay is your original work. Plagiarism is grounds for disqualification.
 - * Submit an official copy of your high school transcript, including 2nd trimester grades, SAT and/or ACT scores optional.
 - * Submit an acceptance letter from an accredited four-year college. If you are waiting for an acceptance letter, please contact your advisor.
 - * The scholarship committee decision is final.
 - * List extracurricular activities, honors and awards.
 - * Return the completed application packet to the following address:
