Volunteer Spotlight *NEW*

Each month, we will feature some of our outstanding parents and family members that make our school and activities so special! For our first month, we'd like to highlight our awesome Book Fair Chairpersons: Kirsten Zoerhoff and Kerry Ellsworth.

<u>Tell us about yourselves:</u> **Kirsten** is a mom to two Croce students (3rd and 5th grade). She's also a substitute teacher within Livermore School District, a Girl Scout Leader, and PTA Hospitality Chairperson. **Kerry** is a mom of three, the youngest is a 5th grader at Croce, one at LHS, and one at Las Positas College. She works part time doing computer programming for utility companies, volunteers with her church, runs the Croce Ice Cream sales on Wednesdays, and enjoys helping out in Croce classrooms, as needed.

<u>What has been your experience volunteering during the</u> <u>Scholastic Book Fair?</u> We love seeing the faces on the kids as we start decorating the week before. They do a good job staying quiet while walking on campus in a line, but it isn't easy because it's so exciting for them. It's been wonderful helping kids get free books and planning games, decorating, and finding ways to involve the students. Seeing the carts of free books that we earn go to the library and classrooms makes all the work worth it.

What is the best part about volunteering?: The sense of accomplishment when the Book Fair is over and knowing you've helped so many kids get excited about reading.
