<u>The Grading</u>

"Class work" and "Homework" will be assigned daily and will cover the material discussed in class or read in the textbook.

The homework will be graded by completion and the student's understanding of practiced material. Its completion carries 25% of the student's grade.

Classroom Participation

Classroom participation will be graded between 10 and 0 points a week. Participation points are earned by arriving in the classroom on time, being prepared, being on task, working diligently, asking and answering appropriate questions, helping other students, and completing in-class assignments. Participation will account for approximately 20% of the grade.

Tests and Quizzes

Tests and quizzes will account for approximately 45% of the grade. All tests will be announced in advance and they count for 25% of a grade. If a test is missed due to an excused absence, the student must take the make-up test at lunch or after school within three days of returning to school. Quizzes will usually be announced ahead of time and count for 20% of the grade. No makeup quizzes will be given. If a quiz is missed due to an excused absence, the student will receive a score proportionate to their score on the unit test covering the same material.

<u>Cheating</u>

Students must not cheat. If someone cheats on course work, test, or quizzes an "F" grade will be provided on that assignment, test, or quiz and may result in removal from class with a semester "F" and loss of credit.

Course Grades

A comprehensive final exam is given at the end of the course and commands up to 10% of the final grade in the class.

The Attendance

Tardy students, pupils who are not properly seated and ready to begin class at the scheduled time will be marked tardy. The Livermore High School Tardy Policy will be adhered to them.

Absences

Students are expected to come to class unless they are ill or excused for important matters. If an absence is excused, it is the student's responsibility to check for and complete assignments or tests missed. The make-up work from the previous day will be in the Algebra 1 binder. (The binder is usually located on the file cabinet in the classroom.)

Bathroom Passes

(Stepping out of the classroom)

If student needs to step out of the classroom he/she has to get teachers attention silently without disrupting the class and get the teacher's permission to leave the classroom. Nobody is allowed to leave the classroom without hall-pass and signing the time-sheet with the correct time leaving and signing in when coming back. (A detailed handout will be given on this issue.)
